What is Pediatric Palliative Care?

Pediatric palliative care aims to enhance the quality of life of children and young people with life-limiting conditions. It focuses on managing pain and symptoms, offering emotional and spiritual support, providing respite care and supporting families through bereavement.

Did you know...

- ★ Accessing palliative care support can be difficult for children with life-limiting conditions, which can result in unnecessary pain and suffering and excruciating strains on families
- ★ There are currently over 40 children's hospice homes in the United Kingdom, several in Canada, two in Australia and others around the world.
- ★ In metro areas around the United States, there are over 4,700 hospice homes for adults, but only a handful that are being built and designed just for children and their unique needs.
- ★ Given the data available, there are over 2,000 children with a potential life-limiting condition in Minnesota that could benefit from respite care and associated services to their family.
- ★ 700 children under the age of 18 die each year in Minnesota, and at least a quarter of those children could potentially benefit from a children's hospice home.
